NOTES:

- If you have a joint membership please can you both sign the form if you both pay tax.
- Please notify The Friends of Canterbury Cathedral if you change your name or address while the declaration is still in force.
- You can cancel the declaration at any time by notifying The Friends of Canterbury Cathedral.
- You must pay an amount of income tax and/or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax that the charity reclaims on your donations in the tax year (Currently 25p per £1 donated. The Government will however give us a supplement of 3p for every £1 donated between 6th April 2008 and 5th April 2011).
- If in the future your circumstances change and you no longer pay tax on your income and capital gains equal to the tax that the charity reclaims, you can cancel your declaration.
- If you pay tax at the higher rate you must include all your Gift Aid donations on your Self Assessment tax return if you want to receive the additional tax relief due to you.
