Aitchison painted his first crucifixion in 1958 and the cross became an important symbol in his paintings throughout his artistic career.

Hambling painted crucifixion images early in her career but in 1986 she painted a Good Friday painting for her frail mother. These works became a ritual painted on Good Friday every year.

There will also be a Fairtrade stall to buy foodstuffs and gift items.

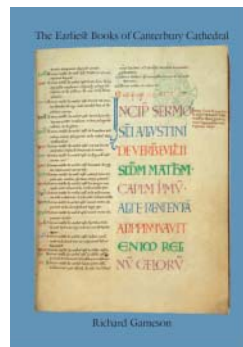
