**TREASURES OF LAMBETH PALACE LIBRARY
400TH ANNIVERSARY EXHIBITION: 1610 – 2010**

Friday 16 July 2010 £30 per person

Includes coach travel, entry to exhibition & Garden Museum, coffee & talk

The exhibition draws upon the Library's incomparably rich and diverse collections of manuscripts, archives and books, some of which will be on display for the first time. It reveals how the collections have developed since 1610 and explores the history surrounding the people who owned, studied or used them as aids to prayer and devotion.

We will leave by coach from Canterbury at 8.30am and be back by 6pm. Our visit starts with coffee and biscuits at Lambeth Palace followed by a talk about the exhibition in the Guard Room by the Librarian and Archivist: Giles Mandelbrote.
