Rarely-used vestments seen for the first time in years.

You may have noticed some unfamiliar vestments being worn at the Harvest Festival Eucharist last Sunday. The green 'High Mass' set - being a chasuble, dalmatic and tunicle (rather than the usual three chasubles) - is made of green and silver brocade with crimson and gold orphreys and lined with grey silk. Their provenance is uncertain, but the chasuble appears in the 1944 British Council film about the cathedral - to be found at https://film.britishcouncil.org/resources/film-archive/message-from-canterbury at 12 minutes and 20 seconds. This set was last worn in 1999.

The copes that were worn on Sunday by the Bishop and Archdeacon of Worcester, are of green Thai silk, and were made by East Kent Embroiderers and dedicated on Trinity Sunday 1988.
