

Welcome to Canterbury Cathedral for this Service

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the cathedral church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the mother church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

Psalms 81.9-17

Hear, O my people, and I will assure thee, O Israel: if thou wilt hearken unto me,

There shall no strange god be in thee: neither shalt thou worship any other god.

First Lesson

Exodus 16.4-15

The Lord said to Moses, 'I am going to rain bread from heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day. In that way I will test them, whether they will follow my instruction or not. On the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in, it will be twice as much as they gather on other days.' So Moses and Aaron said to all the Israelites, 'In the evening you shall know that it was the Lord who brought you out of the land of Egypt, and in the morning you shall see the glory of the Lord, because he has heard your complaining against the Lord. For what are we, that you complain against us?' And Moses said, 'When the Lord gives you meat to eat in the evening and your fill of bread in the morning, because the Lord has heard the complaining that you utter against him—what are we? Your complaining is not against us but against the Lord.'

Then Moses said to Aaron, 'Say to the whole congregation of the Israelites, "Draw near to the Lord, for he has heard your complaining." 'And as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the Israelites, they looked towards the wilderness, and the glory of the Lord appeared in the cloud. The Lord spoke to Moses and said, 'I have heard the complaining of the Israelites; say to them, "At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread; then you shall know that I am the Lord your God." '

In the evening quails came up and covered the camp; and in the morning there was a layer of dew around the camp. When the layer of dew lifted, there on the surface of the wilderness was a fine flaky substance, as fine as frost on the ground. When the Israelites saw it, they said to one another, 'What is it?' For they did not know what it was. Moses said to them, 'It is the bread that the Lord has given you to eat.

During the singing of the hymn, the new Non-Executive Members of Chapter move to places round the High Altar.
The Canon in Residence and an existing Non-Executive Member of chapter lead the Bishop of Dover to the High Altar.

The congregation sits

The Collation

The Non-Executive Members of Chapter are presented to the Bishop by the Canon in Residence.

The Bishop welcomes the new Non-Executive Members of Chapter who then kneel before the Bishop

The Bishop reads a licence and then hands each candidate their licence saying

Receive this share in Christ's ministry which is both yours and mine, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

and each new Non-Executive Member of Chapter responds 'Amen.'

The Bishop takes her pastoral staff and blesses the Non-Executive Members of Chapter, saying

God give you the spirit of holy discipline, of faithfulness, and of love for all his people; and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be upon you and remain with you always. Amen.

The Non-Executive Members of Chapter stand and the Canon in Residence escort and an existing Non-Exectuvie Member of Chapter escort the Non-Executive Members of Chapter to the Dean at the west end of the Quire as the choir sings

The Installation

The Dean leaves his stall as the members of the Foundation stand

The Canon in Residence says

Mr Dean and members of the Cathedral Foundation and congregation, I present to you Pim Baxter, Guy Perricone and Paul Sylva to be installed as a Non-Executive Members of Chapter of this Cathedral and Metropolitical Church.

The Dean says

We welcome you as a member of the Cathedral Foundation and pray that we may assist your growth in Christ as you enrich our fellowship together.

The congregation responds

We welcome you.

The Dean then says

Will you uphold the customs and statutes of this Cathedral and Metropolitical Church?

The Non-Executive Members of Chapter respond

I will.

The Dean leads each Non-Executive Member of Chapter by the hand to a stall in the Quire and says

In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, Amen.

By virtue of the authority vested in me, I install you as a Non-Executive Member of Chapter of this Cathedral and Metropolitical Church.

The Dean then blesses all the Non-Executive Members of Chapter, saying

The Lord preserve your going out and your coming in from this time forth and for evermore.

The Dean returns to the centre of the Quire and all join in the saying of the Foundation Prayer

Eternal God, you have brought us together into a noble company. We pray for one another and for the holy Church of Canterbury; that in this house of our most blessed Saviour, dignity of worship, preaching the faith and holiness of life may for ever abound and thence be spread through all the world, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Dean, and others return to their places

All stand as the choir sings

The Second Lesson

Revelation 2.12-17

'To the angel of the church in Pergamum write: These are the words of him who has the sharp two-edged sword:

'I know where you are living, where Satan's throne is. Yet you are holding fast to my name, and you did not deny your faith in me even in the days of Antipas my witness, my faithful one, who was killed among you, where Satan lives. But I have a few things against you: you have some there who hold to the teaching of Balaam, who taught Balak to put a stumbling-block before the people of Israel, so that they would eat food sacrificed to idols and practise fornication. So you also have some who hold to the teaching of the Nicolaitans. Repent then. If not, I will come to you soon and make war against them with the sword of my mouth. The Collects
