#### Welcome

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597 AD.

## **Visiting Choirs**

The choir of **St Paul's, Canterbury** takes a leading role in the weekly Sunday morning worship, as well as the popular monthly Evensong and Supper services, and other seasonal events. The choir has featured as a visiting choir at several Cathedrals, primarily around South East England, and at Ypres as part of the daily service held under the Menin Gate.

The choir of **St Stephen's, Canterbury** draws singers from across Canterbury who enjoy singing a wide range of sacred music to a high standard. The choir sings two choral services each Sunday and also enjoys the opportunity to sing regularly in Canterbury Cathedral and elsewhere, including cathedrals in Rochester, Chelmsford, Salisbury, Chester, and Rheims in recent years.

**Cantiago chamber choir**, founded in 2008, is a young and enthusiastic choir affiliated with the 'Jacobi Church' in Utrecht (NL). The choir, which is directed by Herman Mussche, sings classical, religious and liturgical music from the 16th to the 21st century.

The Crypt Choir of The King's School Canterbury is the School's senior choir; its primary purpose is to provide music for weekly School services in Canterbury Cathedral, where The King's School is part of the Foundation. The choir also performs in concerts and services at outside venues, most recently at The Royal Naval College, Greenwich; St Giles' and St Mary's Cathedrals in Edinburgh, and in the chapel of King's College Cambridge, whilst recent tours have taken the group to China, Australia, Prague and Rome.

## Informal Organ Recital – Allan Wicks Centenary

On Tuesday 6 June we will be holding an informal organ recital to mark what would have been the 100<sup>th</sup> birthday of Allan Wicks CBE, one of Canterbury Cathedral's former Organists and Master of the Choristers. The recital will be given by three of his former pupils, Peter King, Bryan Gipps and Stephen Pinnock, and will be held in the Quire, after Evensong at 6.15pm. The recital is open to all, free of charge and un-ticketed.

## Organ Festival – Recitals

We are also holding a summer Organ Festival, with three Organ Recitals given by renowned Cathedral organists.
