

Welcome to Canterbury Cathedral for this Service

The Choir of Canterbury Cathedral comprises separate treble lines of boy choristers (aged 7-13) and girl choristers (aged 12-18), as well as 12 professional adult singers, known as Lay Clerks and Choral Scholars. These musicians continue a centuries-old tradition of singing at the Cathedral that dates to its foundation by St Augustine in 597AD.

Today's service is the last at which the Choir will sing before commencing its summer break. On this occasion we bid farewell to three boy choristers, Brandon, Thomas and Jeremy, and to four girl choristers, Connie, Ava, Rosie and Madeleine. Their contribution to the life of the Choir during recent years has been immense; we wish them all the very best of luck in the next stages of their lives. At the same time, we hope that they will always consider Canterbury Cathedral to be home.

Additionally, we bid farewell to one of our Choral Scholars and our Organ Scholar who have spent the past academic year with the Choir. We wish Ben and Ivan the very best as they pursue their future careers. We are delighted that Ellen will remain with the Choir as she takes up a position as a Lay Clerk.

During the Choir's summer break, Cathedral services will be sung by a variety of visiting choirs. The Cathedral Choir will resume its duties on Monday 1 September.
