## Welcome

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597.

We invite everyone who attends our services to contribute to the ongoing costs of maintaining this beautiful Cathedral and investing in our ongoing ministry. It costs us approximately £30,000 a day to care for the building and people of this place and to continue to invest in the high quality of music that is offered here. ## WORSHIP

---

### **Regular worship**

At the heart of Cathedral life is the regular rhythm of daily prayer. The day begins each morning with the quiet, said services of Morning Prayer and the 8.00am Eucharist, and ends with the service of Choral Evensong or Said Evening Prayer. In term time Children's Church meets on Sunday mornings. The Cathedral's principal act of worship every week is the 11.00am Sunday Choral Eucharist.

### **Live streaming**

Choral Eucharists on Sunday, Choral Evensongs, and other special services are routinely live-streamed and available on our website and via YouTube. ## MUSIC

---

### **Visiting Choirs**

The choir of **Christ Church Cathedral, Lexington, Kentucky** sings at all principal liturgies at Christ Church Cathedral. The chorister programme provides rigorous musical training, spiritual formation, and a strong sense of community. Choristers receive instruction in vocal technique, music theory, sight-singing, and liturgical leadership while cultivating discipline, confidence, and lasting friendships. The alto, tenor, and bass section includes accomplished parishioners, many of whom are former choristers and vocal students from the University of Kentucky. Through worship, concerts, recordings, broadcasts, and international tours, the choir advances excellence, enriches cultural and spiritual life, and inspires audiences throughout Lexington and beyond.

**Clerks of Melbourne** is formed of volunteer lay clerks from St Paul's Cathedral, Melbourne, and members of Ensemble Gombert, a chamber choir founded in 1990 to perform High Renaissance polyphony. Singers come from a wide range of professions, and there is an overlap of membership between the two groups. Ensemble Gombert has toured three times to Europe and once to North America. The choir has sung in Westminster Abbey, the Thomaskirche Leipzig, the Frauenkirche Dresden, Strasbourg Cathedral, Grace Cathedral San Francisco, and at the 2006 Levanto Choral Festival in Italy.

**The Vasari Singers** was founded in 1980 and is regarded as one of the leading chamber choirs in Britain. Under the direction of its founder-conductor Jeremy Backhouse, Vasari Singers performs a wide range of repertoire from Renaissance to contemporary. The choir sings regularly at major concert venues and other locations in London and elsewhere, including abroad, having enjoyed tours to Spain, the Baltic States and Italy in recent years. Cathedral residencies are an important part of the choir's year and they are heard frequently on Classic FM and BBC Radio 3.

## MUSIC

---

**Trinity Episcopal Cathedral, Little Rock, Arkansas** is one of the busiest liturgical choirs in the United States. Comprising volunteers, choral scholars, and professionals, they are one of only a handful of American choirs to offer weekly choral evensongs. In addition, they sing over twenty choral masses per season; perform with orchestras several times per season (both liturgically and in concert); and regularly work with guest clinicians, most notably James O'Donnell. Trinity's Director of Music is Dr Colin MacKnight and its Associate Director is Katie Gunn. David Enlow is organist for their residency at Canterbury.

### **Organ Recital by Tom Bell, Concert Organist Messiaen, Livre du Saint Sacrement (1984)**

On Friday 17 July 2026, renowned concert organist Tom Bell will play the Livre du Saint Sacrement, written in 1984 by Olivier Messiaen (1908-1992). Over 100 minutes long, the Livre du Saint Sacrement is a vast cycle in eighteen pieces, collectively presenting a meditation on the Blessed Sacrament: the body and blood of Jesus, in the form of bread and wine at the Eucharist (Holy Communion).

The concert will start at 7.30pm and will last for approximately 105 minutes with no interval.
