WELCOME

Welcome

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597 AD.

Visiting Choirs

The Occasional Singers is a group of local singers who meet a few times each year to sing the services in the Cathedral. The choir is generally directed by one of the cathedral organists and gives an opportunity for local singers to lead the worship during the Cathedral choir's holidays.

Vokalensemble Novantiqua, Bern was founded in 1987 by Bernhard Pfammatter to perform demanding choral repertoire in a small ensemble. The ensemble has travelled widely in Europe and enjoyed success with major works by Bach, Monteverdi and Purcell, but also tackles more modern and contemporary music.

Voces Pacis is a new ensemble which aims to perform choral music at a semi-professional level to enrich the North Texas area, with excellent choral performances throughout the year, and wider afield as the opportunity arises.

The Vasari Singers is one of the UK's top chamber choirs. Regular visitors to Canterbury Cathedral, the choir has a wide and varied repertoire from the Renaissance to contemporary, with a particular focus on commissioning and performing new choral works. Since the group was founded in 1980, they have performed in most UK cathedrals and major concert venues, as well as releasing a number of critically-acclaimed recordings.

The choir of **St George's Episcopal Church, Nashville** is comprised of 45 adults, complemented by 20 younger choristers. The choirs have previously sung in residence at several Cathedrals in the UK and the US, and St George's is proud to be an RSCM-affiliated institution.

The International Children's Choir Festival started in 1997 and this year has drawn eight American choirs to come together for a week in the UK, for a mix of concerts, services and other visits.

The choir of the **Cathedral of St John, Albuquerque** is an auditioned ensemble largely comprised of dedicated and talented volunteer choir members who are supported by a small team of section leaders and choral scholars. The choir's first international tour in 2007 was to Canterbury Cathedral.

WORSHIP

At the heart of Cathedral life is the regular rhythm of daily prayer. The day begins each morning with the quiet, said services of Morning Prayer (Matins) and the 8.00am Eucharist, and ends with the service of Choral Evensong with music from the Cathedral Choir or one of the many excellent visiting choirs who come to sing during the Cathedral Choir's holidays. The Cathedral's principal act of worship every week is the 11.00am Sunday Choral Eucharist.
