## Stained Glass Windows Tour - Tuesday 19th & Saturday 23rd September

Did you know that some stained-glass windows at Canterbury Cathedral are amongst the oldest in the world? Join us on a guided tour, offering an introduction to the history and range of stained glass found at the Cathedral, from medieval to modern. *£5 per person, plus admission charge. Book at our Visitor Centre.* 

### **Canterbury Cathedral Library Tours - Wednesday 20th September**

The Cathedral Library collection includes books on a range of subject matters from the early decades of printing onwards, including books from some of the earliest European printing presses. Join a 45-minute guided tour in the Library building on selected Wednesdays to learn more about the Library and its collections, and explore some of the collection close-up. Tour costs £8 per person. Admission to the Cathedral not included. Pre-booking required, not suitable for under 12s.

#### **Organ Recital Series - Fridays at 6.15pm**

This series of recitals begins again with performances from the Cathedral's resident organists and from guests. Recitals are un-ticketed and free. There is a retiring collection.

#### Luxmuralis: Renaissance: Tue 26 - Sat 30 September - slots from 6.45pm

Luxmuralis follow up last year's incredible Shine at Canterbury Cathedral with a thrilling opening to this year's Festival – prepare for Renaissance.

Visitors are invited to become immersed in the greatest paintings and artworks of the time, to explore through light art and bespoke compositions the wonder and awe that revolutionised Europe, and bridged the gap from the Dark Ages to modern day civilisation. *Tickets: Adult £15, Children (under 16) £12 (Incl. £2 booking fee per ticket)* The tour is expected to take 45 minutes and requires walking and

navigating steps in limited light. Not suitable for those sensitive to flashing lights or loud music. The route is not suitable for buggies; buggy parking will be available. Suitable for all ages – Under 2s go free.

Please note the full route is not accessible for visitors with mobility or other special requirements due to the architecture of the building. Nave-only accessible sessions

#### Foundations of Faith: A Journey through Early Christianity in Kent
