#### Welcome

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597.

We invite everyone who attends our services to contribute to the ongoing costs of maintaining this beautiful Cathedral and investing in our ongoing ministry. It costs us approximately £30,000 a day to care for the building and people of this place and to continue to invest in the high quality of music that is offered here. #### WORSHIP

#### Regular worship

At the heart of Cathedral life is the regular rhythm of daily prayer. The day begins each morning with the quiet, said services of Morning Prayer and the 8.00am Eucharist, and ends with the service of Choral Evensong or Said Evening Prayer. In term time Children's Church meets on Sunday mornings. The Cathedral's principal act of worship every week is the 11.00am Sunday Choral Eucharist.

#### **Visiting Choirs**

The Gundulf Consort is an ad hoc group of experienced church musicians based in Rochester, formed primarily to act as a cathedral visiting choir. In addition to singing in cathedrals, mostly at Canterbury, the Consort has an annual residency at Himmerod Abbey in Germany, singing "English Cathedral Evensong" for a week in August ending on the Patronal Festival of Himmerod's founder, St. Bernard of Clairvaux.

The Vasari Singers is one of the UK's top chamber choirs. Regular visitors to Canterbury Cathedral, the choir has a wide and varied repertoire from the Renaissance to contemporary, with a particular focus on commissioning and performing new choral works. Since the group was founded in 1980, it has performed in most UK cathedrals and major concert venues, as well as releasing a number of critically-acclaimed recordings.

The Choir of Christ & St. Luke's Church, Norfolk is made up of both professional and volunteer musicians who share their love of singing and the Anglican choral tradition. In previous years they have sung residencies at Lincoln, Wells, Norwich, and Gloucester Cathedrals, as well as York Minster. After this week, they head on to St. Paul's Cathedral in London.

**Trinity Church, Boston** has a rich musical tradition that is lived out weekly, with worship services led by an intergenerational choir community of over 100 adults, professional singers, children and teens. Often considered the largest church choir in the Anglican Communion, the choir sings a substantial amount of choral repertoire and strives to feature works by modern and historically underrepresented composers.
