WELCOME

Welcome

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

Although the secular concept of Christmas means that the season is all over by Boxing Day, the season continues through Epiphany to the Presentation of Christ (Candlemas) on 2nd February and this is reflected in our services as we welcome the Magi with their prophetic gifts and reflect on the beginnings of Jesus' ministry following his baptism and as he gathered his disciples together. Candlemas (celebrated on both Sunday 29th and 2nd February) marks the end of the season as we turn our attention towards Lent.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597 AD.

Visiting Choirs

The City of Canterbury Chamber Choir, founded in 1995, puts on regular concerts of sacred and secular choral and dramatic musical works. Their concerts, with conductor Peter Futcher, aim to entertain and educate as well as to help local charities raise much needed funds.

The choir of **Pilgrim Church, Adelaide** is a diverse group of musicians who enjoy singing a wide range of sacred music, including works by living composers. The choir welcomes all visitors to services in Adelaide as well as from around the world online. The choir presents traditional Choral Worship services every Sunday as well as monthly Evensongs and numerous special services throughout the year.

Lees Court Music is a Canterbury based chamber choir which sings as a visiting choir at English cathedrals, at weddings and events, and in concerts in small country churches in Kent in support of local fundraising.

The Occasional Singers is a group of local singers who meet a few times each year to sing the services in the Cathedral. The choir is generally directed by one of the Cathedral organists and gives an opportunity for local singers to lead the worship during the Cathedral Choir's holidays.

On Saturday 25 February 2023, we are delighted to welcome acclaimed and Grammy winning singer, speaker, coach and mentor, Paul Phoenix, to the Cathedral. Paul, who sang tenor in the world famous a cappella group The King's Singers, will be presenting an evening recital at 7.30pm in the Cathedral's Eastern Crypt.

During the recital Paul will discuss his fascinating five decades in music, from his time as a boy chorister at St Paul's Cathedral to his flourishing career as concert soloist and coach/mentor, and will illustrate his journey by performing significant pieces from his life in music, accompanied by Jamie Rogers, Assistant Director of Music.

Tickets for the recital will be £15, plus a non-refundable booking fee of £1.50 per ticket, with under 18s free of charge if accompanied by an adult, and will be available from Canterbury Festival Box Office.

Whilst at the Cathedral, Paul will lead a workshop for children from local schools aged 15 to 18, who are either studying music or interested in singing. Children from local secondary schools have been invited to take part in this exciting event, which will take place in the afternoon before the recital.
