
Livestreaming

The Gathering

All stand as the choir enters in silence.

The choir sings **Requiem aeternam** as the clergy enter

The President says

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Deacon introduces

Prayers of Penitence

God has shone in our hearts to give the light of knowledge of his glory in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in earthen vessels to show that the transcendent power belongs to God and not to us.

As we acknowledge our human frailty, we call to mind our sins of word, deed and omission, and confess them before God our Father.

We remain standing to say

Father eternal, giver of light and grace, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour, in what we have thought, in what we have said and done, through ignorance, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault. We have wounded your love and marred your image in us. We are sorry and ashamed, and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past; and lead us out from darkness to walk as children of light. Amen.

The President says

Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in life eternal, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

The Collect

Let us pray for the peace and well-being of the whole Church.

Everlasting God, our maker and redeemer, grant us, with all the faithful departed, the sure benefits of your Son's saving passion and glorious resurrection, that, in the last day, when you gather up all things in Christ, we may with them enjoy the fullness of your promises; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Liturgy of the Word

Old Testament Reading Wisdom 3.1-9

The souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment will ever touch them.

In the eyes of the foolish they seemed to have died, and their departure was thought to be a disaster, and their going from us to be their destruction; but they are at peace.

For though in the sight of others they were punished, their hope is full of immortality.

Having been disciplined a little, they will receive great good, because God tested them and found them worthy of himself; like gold in the furnace he tried them, and like a sacrificial burnt-offering he accepted them. In the time of their visitation they will shine forth, and will run like sparks through the stubble. They will govern nations and rule over peoples, and the Lord will reign over them for ever. Those who trust in him will understand truth, and the faithful will abide with him in love, because grace and mercy are upon his holy ones, and he watches over his elect.

The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed

The President says

You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honour and power. For you have created all things, and by your will they have their being.

You are worthy, O Lamb, for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed for God saints from every tribe and language and nations.

You have made them to be a kingdom and priests serving our God, and they will reign with you on earth.

The names of those to be remembered are read, silence is kept.

Jesus said: 'This is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me and I will raise them up at the last day.'

Lord God, creator of all, you have made us creatures of this earth, but have also promised us a share in life eternal. According to your promises, may all who have died in the peace of Christ come with your saints to the joys of your kingdom, where there will be neither sorrow nor pain, but life everlasting.

The choir sings

Domine Jesu Christe, rex gloriae, libera animas omnium fidelium defunctorum de poenis inferni et de profundo lacu. Libera eas de ore leonis, ne absorbeat eas Tartarus, ne cadant in obscurum: sed signifer Sanctus Michael repraesentet eas in lucem sanctam quam olim Abrahae promisisti, et semini eius. Hostias et preces tibi, Domine, laudis offerimus: Abraham and his seed. We offer suscipe pro animabus illis, quarum hodie memoriam facimus; fac eas, Domine, de morte transire ad vitam quam olim Abrahae promisisti, et semini eius.

Lord Jesus Christ, king of glory, deliver souls of all the faithful departed from the punishments of hell and from the deep lake. Deliver them from the mouth of the lion, lest Tartarus swallow them up, lest they fall into darkness: but let the standard-bearer Saint Michael bring them back into the holy light which you once promised to prayers and sacrifices of praise to you, Lord: you receive them on behalf of those souls whose memory we recall today; cause them, Lord, to pass from death to the life which you once promised to Abraham and his seed.

Hear us, O merciful Father, as we remember in love those whom we have placed in your hands. Acknowledge, we pray, the sheep of your own fold, lambs of your own flock, sinners of your own redeeming. Enfold them in the arms of your mercy, in the blessed rest of everlasting peace, and in the glorious company of the saints in light. Amen.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.


Members of the congregation greet one another.

The President takes the bread and wine and praises God for his gifts

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of heaven and earth, giver of life and conqueror of death.

By his death on the cross, your Son Jesus Christ offered the one true sacrifice for sin, breaking the power of evil and putting death to flight.

Through his resurrection from the dead you have given us new birth into a living hope, into an inheritance which is imperishable, undefiled and unfading.

The joy of resurrection fills the universe, and so we join with angels and archangels, with all your faithful people, evermore praising you and singing:

The choir sings

Sanctus, sanctus, sanctus, Hol Dominus Deus Sabaoth. God Pleni sunt coeli et terra gloria tua. Hos Hosanna in excelsis. Hos

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine.

Again he praised you, gave it to them and said:

Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

The Deacon says

Praise to you Lord Jesus:

Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life: Lord Jesus, come in glory.

Lord of all life,

help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Breaking of the Bread

The President breaks the consecrated bread, saying

Jesus is the living bread which came down from heaven: if anyone eats of this bread they will live for ever.

Lord, give us this bread always.

'I am the bread of life', says the Lord: 'whoever comes to me will never hunger; whoever believes in me will never thirst.'

'I am the vine; you are the branches' May we dwell in him as he lives in us.

Sit for

The Distribution of Communion

Please come up for Communion as directed by the stewards. All who are regular communicants in their own tradition are welcome to receive the sacrament. If you are not a communicant, you are welcome to come forward at this point in the service to receive a blessing, keeping your hands to your sides. Please ask the priest if you **need a gluten-free host.**

We request that **you do not intinct (dip) your host in the wine** but either take a sip from the cup or remain with your head bowed. This is for the reasons of good hygiene.

If you would like to receive Communion in your place, please inform a steward.

We keep a **prayerful silence** during Communion to allow others to prepare to receive the sacrament or pray afterwards.

During Communion, the choir sings Agnus Dei

Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccata mundi, dona eis requiem Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccata mundi, dona eis requiem, sempiternam requiem.

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant them rest, Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant them rest everlasting.

Prayer after Communion

Stand as the President says

Let us pray.

Silence is kept

God of love, may the death and resurrection of Christ, which we have celebrated in this Eucharist, bring us, with all the faithful departed, into the peace of your eternal home. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ, our rock and our salvation, to whom be glory for time and for eternity. **Amen.**

All then say

Almighty God,
we thank you for feeding us
with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ.
Through him we offer you our souls and bodies
to be a living sacrifice.
Send us out
in the power of your Spirit
to live and work
to your praise and glory. Amen.
