CATHEDRAL NEWS

CLIMATE CHANGE PROTESTS: We welcome any protesters who may have joined us and share in mutual concern for the urgent addressing of action to address climate change. Canterbury Cathedral do not have investments in fossil fuels and are ongoing committed to that policy alongside a wider ethical commitment following the Church of England Ethical Investment Advisory Group advice (EIAG). The Diocese of Canterbury have also already disinvested in fossil fuels and on the 11th Feb the Canterbury Archbishop's Council endorsed our approach which is summarised in this sentence for our next Annual Report. "CBDF has adopted an ethical investment policy which follows the ethical investment advice given by the Church of England Ethical Investment Advisory Group (EIAG) to the National Investing Bodies (NIBs): the Church Commissioners for England, the Church of England Pensions Board and the CBF Church of England Funds (managed by CCLA)." All Canterbury's investments are with CBDF.
