WELCOME

Welcome

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

This month we look with anticipation to the Kingdom of Heaven to which God has called us. It is a time of remembering, beginning with All Saints and All Souls and the annual Armistice commemoration on Remembrance Sunday when we recall the sacrifice of those who have died in war and pledge ourselves to work for peace. We then celebrate Christ the King; king not of an earthly domain but of the heavenly realm. Finally we begin the church's New Year on the 27th when we celebrate Advent Sunday.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597 AD.

During the coming academic year, the Music Department is pleased to present a wide range of events which will include large-scale concerts, intimate recitals, and community workshops. These events will involve the Cathedral's resident musicians, and eminent guest artists.

The Cathedral's Assistant Organist, Robin Walker, will give the last Informal Organ Recital of the Autumn Term on Friday 18 November 2022. This will start at 6.15pm in the Cathedral Quire, and will be free of charge with a retiring collection.

On Saturday 26 November 2022 at 7.30pm, the girl choristers and Lay Clerks of Canterbury Cathedral will be joined by period instrument ensemble, The Harmonious Society of Tickle-Fiddle Gentlemen, and a stellar line up of critically-acclaimed soloists, for a candlelit performance of Handel's Messiah. This concert will be an intimate presentation of some of Handel's most enduring music in the beautiful surroundings of Canterbury Cathedral Quire.

At the heart of Cathedral life is the regular rhythm of daily prayer. The day begins each morning with the quiet, said services of Morning Prayer (Matins) and the 8.00am Eucharist, and ends with the service of Choral Evensong with music from the Cathedral Choir or one of the many excellent visiting choirs who come to sing during the Cathedral Choir's holidays. The Cathedral's principal act of worship every week is the 11.00am Sunday Choral Eucharist.
