Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597.

We invite everyone who attends our services to contribute to the ongoing costs of maintaining this beautiful Cathedral and investing in our ongoing ministry. It costs us approximately £30,000 a day to care for the building and people of this place and to continue to invest in the high quality of music that is offered here. #### **WORSHIP**

### Regular worship

At the heart of Cathedral life is the regular rhythm of daily prayer. The day begins each morning with the quiet, said services of Morning Prayer and the 8.00am Eucharist, and ends with the service of Choral Evensong, with music from the Cathedral Choir or one of the many excellent visiting choirs who come to sing during the Cathedral Choir's holidays, or Said Evening Prayer. The Cathedral's principal act of worship every week is the 11.00am Sunday Choral Eucharist.

# **Visiting Choirs**

The Ashtead Singers was formed many years ago as a small chamber choir. The Singers now frequently sing Cathedral weekend services while the resident choirs are on holiday. The Singers have enjoyed singing in the wonderful surroundings of several Cathedrals as well as weekends in Dublin and further afield. In addition, each year the Singers perform a local concert with a broader choral repertoire. The choir is directed by Dr Andrew Storey.

**Lees Court Music** is a Canterbury based chamber choir which sings as a visiting choir at English Cathedrals, at weddings & events, and in concerts in small country churches in Kent in support of local fund-raising.

The Prometheus Consort is a touring choir consisting of a pool of over 100 singers, visiting Cathedrals and venues around Europe for the past 20 years. Started in Suffolk nearly two decades ago, the choir now includes members from across the UK. The choir has sung services recently at St. Paul's, Southwark, Llandaff and Guildford Cathedral, and is delighted to be singing three services at Canterbury Cathedral.

**Hesperos** is a London-based chamber choir, founded by a small group of former university choral scholars, jointly directed by Chris Breeze and Charlie Warren. Founded in 2018, the choir gives regular concerts, sings for cathedral and church services, and has toured within the UK. The choir performs music from the early to the contemporary, and aims to combine well known and loved choral works with music by lesser-known composers, and those from under-represented groups.

Kent College Choristers come from Kent College, Canterbury. They have had much success in various national competitions, having been finalists several times in BBC Songs of Praise Young Choir of the Year, Barnardo's Choir of the Year and the National Festival of Music for Youth. They also tour abroad, and have sung in a number of European Cathedrals. Many of the Choristers have been selected for the Cathedral Girls' Choir, including two present members.
