Welcome

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597.

We invite everyone who attends our services to contribute to the ongoing costs of maintaining this beautiful Cathedral and investing in our ongoing ministry. It costs us approximately £30,000 a day to care for the building and people of this place and to continue to invest in the high quality of music that is offered here. WORSHIP

Regular worship

At the heart of Cathedral life is the regular rhythm of daily prayer. The day begins each morning with the quiet, said services of Morning Prayer and the 8.00am Eucharist, and ends with the service of Choral Evensong or Said Evening Prayer. In term time Children's Church meets on Sunday mornings. The Cathedral's principal act of worship every week is the 11.00am Sunday Choral Eucharist.

Visiting Choirs

Trinity Episcopal Cathedral, Little Rock, Arkansas has one of the busiest liturgical choirs in the United States. Comprising volunteers, choral scholars, and professionals, they are one of only a handful of American choirs to offer weekly choral evensongs. In addition, they sing over twenty choral masses per season; perform with orchestras several times per season (both liturgically and in concert); and regularly work with guest clinicians, most notably James O'Donnell. Trinity's Director of Music is Dr Colin MacKnight and its Associate Director is Katie Gunn. David Enlow is organist for their residency at Canterbury.

As the mother church of **Berkeley, St Mark's Episcopal Church** boasts the largest volunteer choir in the Diocese of California. Directed by George Emblom since 1992, the choir explores a rich variety of musical eras and traditions. Overseas pilgrimages have been a hallmark of the program since 2003, with this trip to Canterbury marking their seventh residency in England. Organist Jonathan Dimmock—the first American Organ Scholar at Westminster Abbey—has accompanied the choir on every residency. St Mark's also fosters strong interfaith ties with Oakland's Temple Sinai; their joint choir pilgrimages have spanned Israel, Uruguay, and Argentina, with an upcoming journey to southern Spain and northern Morocco this autumn.

The Chancel Choir of **Peachtree Road United Methodist Church** in Atlanta, Georgia, is made up of approximately sixty volunteer and nine professional singers. They provide musical leadership for all weekly worship services as well as for choral services including All Saints Evensong, Lessons and Carols for Advent, Christmas, and Lenten services. The music program includes a full-scale concert series which draws music lovers from across the city. The series includes at least two major choral works by the Chancel Choir each season with members of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. The Peachtree Road Choir has toured internationally for many years. Notably, the Choir has appeared at Notre Dame, Chartres and Reims Cathedral in France and at St Paul's, Wells Cathedral and Westminster Abbey in the United Kingdom. Scott Atchison has been the Director of Music and Organist since 1982. The choirs are also supported by Associate Organist and Choirmaster, Oak Martin; Assistant Organist, Robin Hensley and Ruth Sommerville, Music and Arts Coordinator.

MUSIC

Caelestis started as a choir to sing Evensong at a parish church in York in 2017, exclusively comprising students from the University of York. In 2019 the choir embarked on its first cathedral visit to Ripon Cathedral, and ever since has been regularly visiting the UK's major churches and cathedrals. Today the choir continues to be directed by its founder, Joel Starkie, and Timothy Selman (Assistant Director of Music at Nottingham Cathedral) and has often been aided by the playing of William Campbell (Assistant Director of Music at Peterborough Cathedral, and formerly Organ Scholar at Canterbury Cathedral). The community has evolved to include singers from all over Yorkshire, as well as friends and family from further afield. Most recently the choir has completed visits to: York Oratory; York Minster; Durham Cathedral; St George's Chapel, Windsor; and HMCR Hampton Court Palace.

The Pearce Singers was formed at Salisbury Cathedral in 2003 as a reunion of chorister friends from SS. Peter & Paul, Tring, along with the many choral friendships that evolved from the group since. The choir was named in memory of the choirmaster, Keith Pearce, who taught his choristers with diligence, and instilled in them a love for the English choral tradition. Over the years the choir has found its reunions, singing services at many cathedrals, a great gift for its friendships and passion for music.

Southern Cathedral Singers was born out of an RSCM group created by the late Martin How. Singing at UK cathedrals they are comprised of members of parish choirs from around the South and cover for Cathedral choirs when they are on holiday. Jeremy Jackman who is directing on 31st August is a former King's Singer. Dan Soper is organist for the day, a regular to Canterbury Cathedral who plays for numerous other visiting choirs.
