# WELCOME

---

## Welcome

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597 AD.

## Visiting Choirs

**Mercia Chorale** is an ad hoc choir broadly based in the Midlands, with singers connected to the region through university, work, or by birth. As well as undertaking an annual cathedral residency, the choir performs fundraising concerts, including Christmas carols, and enjoys the challenge of putting together performances within a limited timeframe.

**Luceat** consists of some of the finest singers from collegiate and cathedral environments throughout the UK and specialises in the reconstruction of historic liturgies. The choir has released two CDs to critical acclaim.

**The Tudeley Singers** is an amateur choir based in Kent. Formed in 2018, the choir sings services in cathedrals during the holidays, as well as a number of concerts each year in aid of charities.

The Girls' Choir of the **Collegiate Church of St Mary, Warwick** was founded in 1990 by the then Director of Music, Simon Lole. The choristers attend schools across Warwick and beyond, and regularly sing services by themselves and with the Gentlemen of the Choir. The choristers frequently feature on broadcasts, most recently on BBC One on Easter Day 2019 and BBC Radio 3 Choral Evensong in 2021.

The choir of **St Paul's, Canterbury** takes a leading role in the weekly Sunday morning worship, as well as the popular monthly Evensong and Supper services, and other seasonal events. The choir has featured as a visiting choir at several cathedrals, primarily around south east England, and at Ypres as part of the daily service held under the Menin Gate.

**Lees Court Music** is a Canterbury based chamber choir which sings as a visiting choir at English cathedrals, at weddings and events, and in concerts in small country churches in Kent in support of local fundraising.

**The Occasional Singers** is a group of local singers who meet a few times each year to sing the services in the Cathedral. The choir is generally directed by one of the Cathedral organists and gives an opportunity for local singers to lead the worship during the Cathedral Choir's holidays.

At the heart of Cathedral life is the regular rhythm of daily prayer. The day begins each morning with the quiet, said services of Morning Prayer (Matins) and the 8.00am Eucharist, and ends with the service of Choral Evensong with music from the Cathedral Choir or one of the many excellent visiting choirs who come to sing during the Cathedral Choir's holidays. The Cathedral's principal act of worship every week is the 11.00am Sunday Choral Eucharist.
