The Easter Liturgy 2023

Welcome to Canterbury Cathedral for this Service

From earliest times Christians have gathered through the night of Easter Eve to recall the story of God's saving work, from creation through to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. However, the Easter Liturgy is not only a presentation of God's work. It is meant to be a real experience of new life for the worshipper, a passing from darkness to light which offers hope to all the faithful. Indeed, the themes of death to life, darkness to light, destruction to new creation occur over and over again in the various sections of the service: the lighting of the Paschal Candle, the readings, the renewal of baptism vows, and the Eucharist in which all are united with Christ in his death and resurrection.

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The Vigil

When the service is about to begin the lights will be put out and the ministers enter in silence. As we wait in the darkness we listen to the account of God's salvation from the Old Testament.

The light by which the readings are to be read is lit.

Lighten our darkness, Lord, we pray, and in your great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night, for the love of your only Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.

Amen.

This is the night in which our Lord Jesus Christ passed over from death to life. The Church invites her members, dispersed throughout the world, to gather in vigil and prayer. For this is the Passover of the Lord, in which through word and sacrament we share in his victory over death.

As we await the risen Christ, let us hear the record of God's saving deeds in history, recalling how he saved his people in ages past and in the fullness of time sent his Son to be our Redeemer. Let us pray that through this Easter celebration God may bring to perfection in each of us the saving work he has begun.

The cantor sings the response and then it is repeated by the congregation.



The Collect

Lord God of our salvation, you speak the word to your scattered people, and bring up our life from the valley of death: breathe your Spirit upon your Church, that we may live and stand before you in the confidence of your risen Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord. **Amen.**

The Service of Light

The clergy process to the West Door and the congregation turns to face them.

The president says

Eternal God, who made this most holy night to shine with the brightness of your one true light: set us aflame with the fire of your love, and bring us to the radiance of your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The president then traces the Greek letters, Alpha and Omega, the cross and the numerals of this year on the Paschal Candle, saying

Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega, all time belongs to him, and all ages; to him be glory and power, through every age and for ever.

Amen.

He then blesses the incense studs and inserts them into the Candle reminding us of the five wounds of Christ.

By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard and keep us.

Amen.

The president lights the candle from the new fire, saying

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

The minister bearing the Candle enters the cathedral, followed by the others ministers.

The minister bearing the Candle sings

The light of Christ.

Thanks be to God.

The procession of the Easter Candle moves further into the Nave, stopping twice more. The versicle and response are repeated, and the light of the Easter Candle is passed to all.

After the last proclamation the Candle is placed in its stand and censed.

The Exsultet (the Easter Song of Praise) is sung

Exsultet

Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of Angels; O Universe, dance around God's throne! Jesus Christ, our King is risen! Sound the trumpet of salvation. Rejoice, O earth, in glory, revealing the splendour of your creation, radiant in the brightness of your triumphant King!

Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in Glory! The risen Saviour, our Lord of life, shines upon you! Let all God's people sing and shout for joy.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right and good that with hearts and minds and voices we should praise you, Father almighty, the unseen God, through your only Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, who has saved us by his death, paid for us the price of Adam's sin, and reconciled us once again to you.

For this is the Passover feast,

when Christ, the true Lamb of God is slain,

whose blood consecrates the homes of all the faithful.

This is the night when you first saved our ancestors,

freeing Israel from her slavery and leading her safely through the sea,

This is the night when Jesus Christ vanquished hell,

broke the chains of death

and rose triumphant from the grave.

This is the night when all who believe in him

are freed from sin, restored to grace and holiness.

This is the night that gave us back what we had lost;

beyond our deepest dreams you made even our sin a happy fault.

Most blessed of all nights!

Evil and hatred are put to flight and sin is washed away,

lost innocence regained, and mourning turned to joy.

Night truly blessed, when hatred is cast out,

peace and justice find a home,

and heaven is joined to earth and all creation reconciled to you.

Therefore, heavenly Father, in this our Easter joy

accept our sacrifice of praise,

your Church's solemn offering;

this wax, the work of bees and the hands of your ministers.

As we gaze upon the splendour of this flame,

fed by melting wax conceived by Mother bee,

grant that this Easter Candle may make our darkness light.

For Christ, the Morning Star, has risen in glory;

Christ is risen from the dead and his flame of love still burns within us!

Christ sheds his peaceful light on all the world!

Christ lives and reigns for ever and ever.

Amen.

The Easter Acclamation

All stand as the organ sounds

The congregation extinguish their candles, and bells are rung loudly

The president proclaims

Alleluia! Christ is risen.

He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

Remain standing as the choir sings

Gloria in Excelsis

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory. Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, only begotten Son. Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us, you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer, you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy upon us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

The Collect

The president says

Let us pray that we may reign with the risen Christ in glory.

Lord of all life and power,

who through the mighty resurrection of your Son

overcame the old order of sin and death to make all things new in him:

grant that we, being dead to sin and alive to you in Jesus Christ, may reign with him in glory;

to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be praise and honour, glory and might, now and in all eternity.

Amen.

Sit

The Epistle Romans 6.3-11

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

This is the word of the Lord.

The Liturgy of Initiation

Prayer of Thanksgiving over the Water

The president stands before the water of baptism and says

Praise God who made heaven and earth, who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ was baptized in the river Jordan: we thank you for the gift of water to cleanse us and revive us. Saving God,

give us life.

We thank you that through the waters of the Red Sea you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the Promised Land. Saving God,

give us life.

We thank you that through the deep waters of death you brought your Son, and raised him to life in triumph. Saving God,

give us life.

Bless this water, that all who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and in his resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Saving God, give us life.

Send your Holy Spirit upon all the baptized, bring them to new birth in the household of faith, and raise them with Christ to full and eternal life; for all might, majesty, authority, and power are yours, now and for ever.

Saving God,

As we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead, we remember that through the paschal mystery we have died and been buried with him in baptism.

To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

give us life.

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God? **I reject them.**

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil? **I renounce them.**

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour? **I repent of them.**

Profession of Faith

The president addresses the congregation

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting.
Amen.

The Peace

The president says

The risen Christ came and stood among his disciples and said, 'Peace be with you.'
Then were they glad when they saw the Lord. Alleluia.

The peace of the risen Christ be always with you.

And also with you. Alleluia.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

Members of the congregation greet one another. Please be respectful of others' safety and their desire to keep distance.

Remain standing to sing **The Offertory Hymn** during which the table is prepared and the gifts of the people are gathered and presented.



At the Lamb's high feast we sing praise to our victorious King, who hath washed us in the tide flowing from his piercèd side; praise we him, whose love divine gives his sacred blood for wine, gives his body for the feast, Christ the victim, Christ the priest.

²Where the Paschal blood is poured, death's dark angel sheathes his sword; Israel's hosts triumphant go through the wave that drowns the foe. Praise we Christ whose blood was shed, Paschal victim, Paschal bread; with sincerity and love eat we manna from above.

³Mighty victim from the sky, hell's fierce powers beneath thee lie; thou hast conquered in the fight, thou hast brought us life and light. Now no more can death appal, now no more the grave enthral: thou hast opened paradise, and in thee thy saints shall rise.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, always and everywhere to give you thanks, almighty and eternal Father, and on this night of our redemption to celebrate with joyful hearts the memory of your wonderful works. For by the mystery of his passion Jesus Christ, your risen Son, has conquered the powers of death and hell and restored in men and women the image of your glory. He has placed them once more in paradise and opened to them the gate of life eternal. And so, in the joy of this Passover, Earth and heaven resound with gladness, while angels and archangels and the powers of creation sing for ever the hymn of your glory:

The choir sings

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Accept our praises, heavenly Father, through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, and, as we follow his example and obey his command, grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit these gifts of bread and wine may be to us his body and his blood;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, heavenly Father, we remember his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross; we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; we look for the coming of your kingdom, and with this bread and this cup we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died: Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of thanks and praise, and as we eat and drink these holy gifts in the presence of your divine majesty, renew us by your Spirit, inspire us with your love and unite us in the body of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise:

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen.

The president breaks the consecrated bread, saying

Jesus says, I am the bread of life, whoever eats this bread will live for ever.

Lord, our hearts hunger for you; give us this bread always.

The president says

Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us. **Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.**

Sit as the president and other ministers begin

The Distribution of Communion

Please come up for Communion as directed by the stewards. All who are regular communicants in their own tradition are welcome to receive the sacrament. If you are not a communicant, you are welcome to come forward at this point in the service to receive a blessing, keeping your hands to your sides. Please ask the priest if you **need a gluten-free host.**

We request that **you do not intinct (dip) your host in the wine** but either take a sip from the cup or remain with your head bowed. This is for the reasons of good hygiene.

If you wish to receive communion without climbing the steps to the High Altar, please join the line for the station in the North-East Transept.

We keep a **prayerful silence** during Communion to allow others to prepare to receive the sacrament or pray afterwards.

During Communion, the choir sings the Agnus Dei

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.





Bread is blessed and broken, wine is blessed and poured: take this and remember Christ the Lord.

God the Son, who in bursting from the grave has won a glorious victory, give you joy as you share the Easter faith. **Amen.**


God the Holy Spirit, who filled the disciples with the life of the risen Lord, empower you and fill you with Christ's peace.
