Welcome from

Dean David

Our programmes for worship, events and activities for these months are underpinned by a theme of 'HOPE'.

This reflects the time of the year, as winter draws in and spring stretches out.

It connects with the Christian season of Lent, which although includes penance and fasting, is really a season about learning to hope afresh in God's goodness, despite our failures.

This then takes us into Holy Week and Easter, which again is a festival of hope, as we celebrate the costs of love and new life revealed in the resurrection of Jesus. This year it is amplified by the Pope, who has invited all Christians to mark 2025 as a 'Year of Hope'.

I have been surprised by hope; as to where it comes, and from whom it emerges. I have learnt it is not obvious, and is not achieved by positive thinking or a cheery outlook, but is something of far greater importance and depth.

Hope seems to emerge from dire situations, and yet speaks of the underlying way things are truly shaped by a love which doesn't let anyone, or any place, down. The news, and too many situations, weigh us down to sadness and beyond. But, hope resets us into the present, with the ability to look forward to a future which is both unknown, yet undoubtedly shaped by love.

One letter in the Bible written to a very dispersed community facing great challenges, speaks of them having 'a living hope'. That is also what we stand for at Canterbury Cathedral; and we invite you in to explore the gifts of hope built into our ancient walls, and lived today through this community called to witness, to hope.
