WELCOME

Welcome

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597 AD.

MUSIC

Visiting Choirs

Lees Court Music is a Canterbury based chamber choir which sings as a visiting choir at English cathedrals, at weddings and events, and in concerts in small country churches in Kent in support of local fundraising.

Peterborough Chamber Choir was founded in 1984, although the members now come from across the UK. This year the choir has sung services in Ely, Winchester, Tewkesbury, Worcester and Blackburn. It has also recently visited other European countries, singing in Holland, France and Belgium.

The Gundulf Consort is a new *ad hoc* group of experienced church musicians based in Rochester, formed primarily to act as a cathedral visiting choir.

The Occasional Singers is a group of local singers who meet a few times each year to sing the services in the Cathedral. The choir is generally directed by one of the Cathedral organists and gives an opportunity for local singers to lead the worship during the Cathedral Choir's holidays.

The choir of the **United Benefice of Standon and The Mundens with Sacombe** is a mixed voice choir serving the three churches in the benefice, singing at one service in the benefice each Sunday, including a monthly Choral Evensong.

Concerts

During the coming academic year, the Music Department is pleased to present a wide range of events which will include large-scale concerts, intimate recitals, and community workshops. These events will involve the Cathedral's resident musicians, and eminent guest artists.

In the Autumn Term, Informal Organ Recitals will take place on Friday 21 October and Friday 18 November 2022. These will start at 6.15pm in the Cathedral Quire, will be free of charge with a retiring collection, and will feature the Cathedral's resident organists:

Friday 21 October: David Newsholme, Director of Music

Friday 18 November: Robin Walker, Assistant Organist

On Saturday 26 November 2022 at 7.30pm, the girl choristers and Lay Clerks of Canterbury Cathedral will be joined by period instrument ensemble, The Harmonious Society of Tickle-Fiddle Gentlemen, and a stellar line up of critically-acclaimed soloists, for a candlelit performance of Handel's Messiah. This concert will be an intimate presentation of some of Handel's most enduring music in the beautiful surroundings of Canterbury Cathedral Quire.

WORSHIP

At the heart of Cathedral life is the regular rhythm of daily prayer. The day begins each morning with the quiet, said services of Morning Prayer (Matins) and the 8.00am Eucharist, and ends with the service of Choral Evensong with music from the Cathedral Choir or one of the many excellent visiting choirs who come to sing during the Cathedral Choir's holidays. The Cathedral's principal act of worship every week is the 11.00am Sunday Choral Eucharist.
