HOLY WEEK AT CANTERBURY CATHEDRAL

ARCHBISHOP'S PASSIONTIDE TALKS: On the evenings of Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at 7 pm Archbishop Justin will be giving his Passiontide series of talks in the Nave with additions from the Canons and in conversation with others.

<u>PRECINCTS PILGRIMAGE FOR HOLY WEEK:</u> At 11 am and then again at 3 pm members of the Community of St Anselm will be offering an hour long Precincts pilgrimage on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week. To book for this please go to our website.

FRUITS OF THE SPIRIT: As part of the 'Fruits of the Spirit' collaboration with the National Gallery, there will be a series of daily mini-talks from Monday to Thursday in Holy Week led by our expert guides on the theme of Art and Peace, looking at examples from the Cathedral's art collection. These are free with no need to book but please see the notices inside the Cathedral for each day's programme.

ORIGAMI WORKSHOPS: In addition to the mini-talks on the 'Fruits of the Spirit' there will also be origami workshops held in the Community Studio from 10.30 to 3 pm Tuesday and Wednesday in Holy Week where you have the opportunity to make your own doves of peace.

MAUNDY THURSDAY: On the 6th April we will be keeping Maundy Thursday the day during Holy Week that commemorates the Washing of the Feet and Last Supper of Jesus with the Apostles. At 11.00 Chrism Service, Renewal of Ordination Vows and blessing of the oils. Evensong will be said at 5.30 pm and then at 7.30 pm it is the Liturgy of Maundy Thursday followed by a silent vigil until 11 pm.

GOOD FRIDAY: On Good Friday, the 7th April, we remember the crucifixion of Jesus and the sacrifice he made for us with a solemn day of services. At 10.15 am there is a Family Service for Good Friday led by Dean David followed by the three hours devotion before the cross beginning at 12 noon. The first two hours consist of prayers, hymns and a homily given by each of the Canons and the last hour will be the Good Friday Liturgy with Veneration of the Cross beginning at 2 pm. In the evening at 7.30pm there will be a concert of Music

for Passiontide by Candlelight, sung by the boys and Lay Clerks of the Cathedral Choir.

<u>HOLY SATURDAY:</u> From 11 am to 12.30 pm on 8th April there is a Children's Easter Workshop with Easter crafts, bible stories and building of the Easter Garden. This is a free event but please register online. Then in the evening at 9 pm we have our Easter Eve Vigil with marks the first celebration of Eastertide. This atmospheric candlelit service moves from darkness to light at Christ's resurrection.

STORIES SET IN STONE: The Archives and Library team has installed a new display in the Viewing Gallery above the shop; the set of cathedral models needed to come off display for conservation reasons. The new display is called 'Stories set in stone' and includes various exhibits dating from the 9th century to the present day telling the story of working in stone. The display includes items on loan from St Mary's Church Reculver and from Canterbury Museums and Galleries, alongside items from the cathedral's 'lapidarium' collection. The preparation and installation of this display, alongside the relocation and reordering of the 'lapidarium', represents a significant piece of work. Do take a chance to have a look.
