## FUTURE DATES FOR YOUR DIARY



If you are drawn to **SILENT PRAYER**, do come and join our new Julian Meeting, which is held on the first Tuesday of each month from 6.30pm in the crypt, beginning on **Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September**. Silent or contemplative prayer began around the 4<sup>th</sup> century and Julian Meetings (after Julian of Norwich) have

been held nationwide since 1973 – for people of all denominations, faiths or none who wish to join with others in the practice of silent prayer; to give time and space to allow God's stillness by laying everything aside, just 'being', not 'doing'. Resting in the present moment. Meetings gather at the south door of the cathedral after Evensong and then we go into the crypt, a sentence or meditation is read followed by half an hour's silent prayer ending with the sentence being repeated. Dates for the coming months are: 1<sup>st</sup> October, 5<sup>th</sup> November, Monday 9<sup>th</sup> December, 7<sup>th</sup> January 2020.
