Visiting Choirs

Caritas Chamber Choir

Caritas is a Kent-based chamber choir, passionate about raising money for charities through singing, and performing to the highest level both in the UK and throughout Europe. The choir performs music from all periods and holds an annual Competition for Emerging Composers. The Founder and Music Director is Benedict Preece.

St Stephen's, Canterbury

St Stephen's Church Choir draws singers from across Canterbury who enjoy singing a wide range of sacred music to a high standard. The choir sings two choral services each Sunday and also enjoys the opportunity to sing regularly in Canterbury Cathedral and elsewhere, including cathedrals in Rochester, Chelmsford, Salisbury, Chester, and Rheims in recent years. St Stephen's Church Choir is directed by Stephen Barker.

Schola Liturgica

Schola Liturgica was founded to promote Anglican church music and liturgy in The Netherlands and Belgium. The choir has toured many British and Irish cathedrals, churches and abbeys to sing the daily services during the holidays. The singers come from all over The Netherlands. Geke Bruining-Visser is the director of the choir and the organist is Mattijs de Vreugd.

We are delighted that, starting on 17 December on days leading up to Christmas, Mary Morley will play music on the harp before and after Evensong. As well as being a wonderful harpist, Mary is acting House Parent to the boy choristers at Choir House.

At the heart of Cathedral life is the regular rhythm of daily prayer. The day begins each morning with the quiet, said services of Morning Prayer (Matins) and the 8.00am Eucharist, and ends with the service of Choral Evensong with music from the Cathedral Choir or one of the many excellent visiting choirs who come to sing during the Cathedral Choir's holidays. The Cathedral's principle act of worship every week is the 11.00am Sunday Choral Eucharist.
