Welcome

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597 AD.

WORSHIP

Regular worship

At the heart of Cathedral life is the regular rhythm of daily prayer. The day begins each morning with the quiet, said services of Morning Prayer (Matins) and the 8.00am Eucharist, and ends with the service of Choral Evensong, with music from the Cathedral Choir or one of the many excellent visiting choirs who come to sing during the Cathedral Choir's holidays, or Said Evening Prayer. The Cathedral's principal act of worship every week is the 11.00am Sunday Choral Eucharist.

Live streaming

Choral Eucharists on Sunday, Choral Evensongs, and other special services are routinely live-streamed and available on our website and via YouTube. If you attend these services you may be seen on camera, and by attending these services you give your permission to appear in this way. Visiting Choirs

Lees Court Music is a Canterbury based chamber choir which sings as a visiting choir at English Cathedrals, at weddings & events, and in concerts in small country churches in Kent in support of local fundraising.

Canterbury Chamber Choir, founded in 1995, puts on regular concerts of sacred and secular choral and dramatic musical works. Their concerts, with conductor Peter Futcher, aim to entertain and educate as well as to help local charities raise much needed funds.

Guildford Chamber Choir was founded in 1980 and gives three main concerts each year as well as foreign tours and Cathedral residencies in the UK. The Choir sets the highest possible musical standards, striving for innovation and variety in programmes from early Renaissance to contemporary music. The choir will be conducted by Martin Holford, formerly Director of Music at Holy Trinity, Guildford.

The Gundulf Consort is a recently formed *ad hoc* group of experienced church musicians based in Rochester, formed primarily to act as a cathedral visiting choir.

Kent College Choristers come from Kent College, Canterbury. They have had much success in various national competitions, having been finalists several times in BBC Songs of Praise Young Choir of the Year, Barnardo's Choir of the Year and the National Festival of Music for Youth. They also tour abroad, and have sung in a number of European cathedrals. Many of the Choristers have been selected for the Cathedral Girls' Choir.

Join the Cathedral Choir

The next round of auditions for boy choristers will take place on Saturday 11 May 2024. These auditions are for boys currently in Years 2-6. Successful candidates will be invited to join the choir in June 2024 (years 3-6) or September 2024 (Year 2). If you are interested in the auditions, please fill in the online form by Sunday 5 May to book a place.

The next round of auditions for girl choristers will take place on Saturday 29 June 2024. These auditions are for girls looking to join the choir when they begin year 8 in September 2024. If you are interested in the auditions, please fill in the online form by Sunday 23 June to book a place.

Please note that parents (at least one) are asked to stay at the Cathedral with their child throughout auditions.
